Lift staffing cap for NDIS

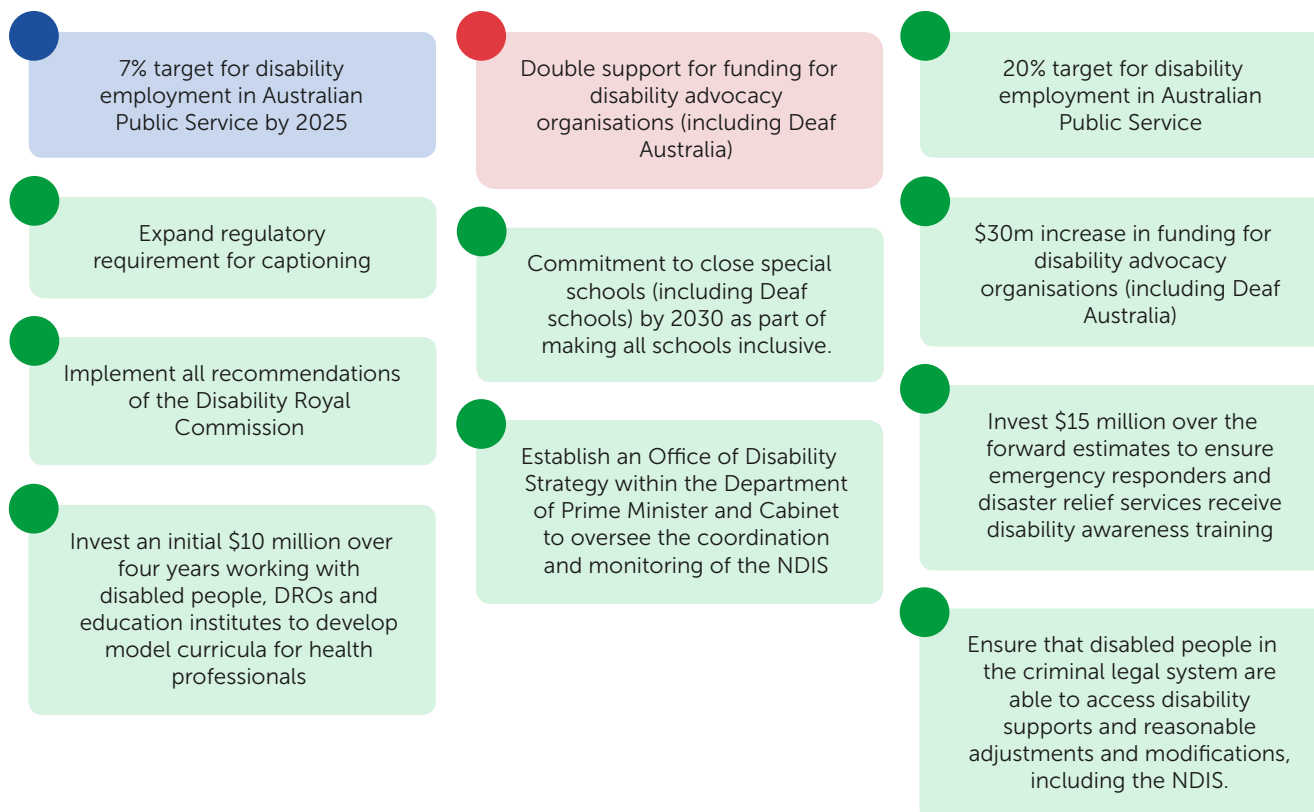
Disability awareness training for NDIS staff
