
Ennasi and the Enemy



When I woke up the next morning, I heard people talking on the TV. As the news reporter ended his sentence, he stated "...well I'm sure glad that my children aren't disabled."




"Oh no!" I said, "It's the Great Assumption Enemy! I didn't know that it could come out of a screen! What am I supposed to do: I don't feel very super."


